

## **Storm Debris Update**

All of the hazardous limb trimming and tree cutting from the Christmas Day ice storm was completed on April 12<sup>th</sup> by Evergreen Tree Service. Wood Resource Recovery (aka Gaston Tree Service) began their storm debris collection and removal on April 19. To date approximately 50% of the initial sweep through Town is complete. The first sweep of the entire Town is expected to be completed by Monday, May 3<sup>rd</sup>. A second round of clean up will take place after May 3<sup>rd</sup> and should be completed in the course of one week, weather permitting. All residents are encouraged to place all limbs and brush at the edge of the street by May 3<sup>rd</sup> in preparation for the second and final debris removal sweep.


# Bi- Annual Clean Up

Please do not block any ditches or drains. This pick-up includes white goods, yard debris (leaves, tree branches), mattresses, paint cans, etc. PAINT IN CANS MUST BE DRY OR HAVE KITTY LITTER ADDED TO ABSORB THE PAINT. Residents do NOT need to call and have their names put on a list. The Bi-Annual Cleanup is offered in the fall and spring of each year.

# **Wood Promoted to Captain**

The Blowing Rock Police Department is pleased to announce the promotion of Sergeant Justin Wood to the rank of Captain. Captain Wood has been with the department for 10 years. He served as Sergeant since January 2007 where he was responsible for our Crime Prevention and ABC Enforcement programs. Captain Wood recently attended an Internal Affairs Investigation school and is responsible for our departments Professional Standards including Internal Affairs and background investigations for new hires. Captain Wood is currently attending the North Carolina Justice Academy's Management Development Program. Justin is actively involved in the group ASAP (Ashe County Suicide and Prevention) where he attends meetings with civic groups discussing suicide awareness and its effects on survivors. This group also focuses on giving those in need support and finding ways to deter suicide. Justin currently resides in Ashe County with his wife Monica and three daughters.
