

Bass Lake Sidewalk Project To Begin in March









Many years in the making, the Bass Lake Sidewalk Project is finally close to being a reality. On January 30th the Town of Blowing Rock held a bid opening for the Bass Lake Sidewalk Project. A total of four bids were received with the low bid being received from Country Boy Landscaping of the town of Harmony in Iredell Country at \$976,959. The Town Council unanimously approved the contract with Country Boy Landscaping on February 11, 2020. THE PROJECT GENERALLY CONSISTS OF: 2,850 linear feet of sidewalk along U.S. Highway 221 between the Bass Lake Parking Area and ending at the intersection of Main and Hill Streets. Project scope includes sidewalk, curb and gutter, segmental block retaining wall, storm drainage, asphalt paving and striping. Funding of the project will consist of a \$980,000 Eastern Federal Lands Access Program Grant as well as \$242,000 in matching funds to complete the project, including engineering services. The contract with Country Boy Landscaping will begin in earnest March 16, 2020 with a final completion date for the project being September 14, 2020. The Main Street section on the project must be completed prior to May 29, 2020.

New Parade Times for 2020

During the February Town Council meeting it was decided to move both the Town's 4th of July Parade and the Christmas Parade to 10 a.m. This change is intended to encourage better traffic flow for the festival days with potentially less parking being held for parade viewing. Council also decided that parking will be prohibited on Main Street on parade mornings, and will open up after parades are complete. This should improve visibility and increase safety for parade viewers, particularly children.

Semi-Annual Water Line Flushing

The Town of Blowing Rock is planning the first of its two semi-annual "flushing" of the water lines to take place on **Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, May 5th, 6th,** and **7th, 2020.** This important preventive maintenance routine helps ensure our system customers have sustained levels of high water quality by removing sediment and deposits from the less used areas of the system. Some customers may briefly experience a temporary slight discoloration of water in the immediate vicinity of the flushing activity. If this happens in your area, please run your cold-water faucet to flush out the service line to your property. For rare but occasional extended discoloration, please contact Town Hall at (828) 295-5200 with your location and we will work to clear up any issues.
