

Bixby Promoted to Lieutenant



The Blowing Rock Police Department is pleased to announce the promotion of Hank

Lieutenant Hank Bixby Bixby to the rank of Lieutenant. Lieutenant Bixby has been with the department for 13 years, having joined us from the National Park Service where he served as a Wildland Firefighter and Seasonal Law Enforcement Ranger. Hank has served the department in the area of Field Training, as an accident reconstruction specialist and as a liaison with Law Enforcement Support Services. He possesses training qualifying him to maintain and repair the department's firearms. Hank will oversee the Patrol Division to include scheduling. events planning and supervision. Bixby lives in Blowing Rock with his wife and daughter. They are expecting a son in October.

2010-2011 Budget Approved

Following various budget work sessions and a public hearing, the Town of Blowing Rock FY 2010-2011 Budget was adopted at the June 8, 2010 Town Council meeting. A synopsis of the budget is available on the town website www.townofblowingrock.com.

The FY 2010-2011 Budget totals \$6,396,970, has a tax rate set at \$0.28 per \$100 valuation, which is the current tax rate. The Budget also includes - a \$3.00 per month fee to all residential solid waste customers to cover costs associated with implementation of a weekly curbside recycling program, and changes to water and sewer fees, with an increase of \$0.50 per month in both water and sewer fees and a reduction in the water interconnection fee of \$1.00 per month, which results in no net change. All other charges/fees are unchanged.

The Town of Blowing Rock will begin providing curbside recycling collection for residential solid waste customers beginning August 1, 2010 as follows:

GDS CURBSIDE RECYCLING

Curbside recycling is collected by GDS, Inc. one day per week for all residential customers. Please place your recyclable items in the bin provided by 6:00 a.m. on your route day for collection. Remove lids from bottles and jars, rinse all containers, and flatten all plastics. Do not mix household garbage with recyclables. Items collected are listed below.

Ice Storm Clean Up

By the first week in June, all of the 2009 ice storm debris was collected from town streets and ground into chips for processing. Total reimbursable cost of storm debris removal and clean up is approximately \$155,000.00.

Downtown Streetscape

Phase I of the Downtown Streetscape is now complete. Wilke Construction recently completed the stamped crosswalks at Laurel Lane, Pine Street, and Chestnut Street.
