
ing Rock Food Lion for six years.



Brahm construction progress



Construction is progressing with Boone Construction Company. Several items that are being added at this point in construction are: stone on the lower level of the parking structure and on the back (west side) of the structure, fluid applied membrane air barrier/vapor permeable (green material) to the exterior sheathing, and the exterior

rior walls are being prepared for insulation. In the next few weeks the roof shingles (GAF 50-year warranty/heavy, architectural shingle), fire-treated cedar wall shingles, Pella windows (these are custom windows that are high efficiency), sequence one "Store Front" (large windows at the front door), and the dry wall for fire ceiling on the bottom of the roof trusses will be installed.



Do's and Do Not's for Disposal of Grease

Fats, Oils, and Greases aren't just bad for arteries and waistlines; they're bad for sewers, too. Sewer overflows and backups can cause health hazards, damage home interiors, and threaten the environment. An increasingly common cause of overflows is sewer pipes blocked by grease. Below are some helpful tips to keep in mind when disposing of oil & grease.

DO'S

- Put oil and grease in collection containers
- * Remove oil and grease from kitchen utensils, equipment and food preparation areas with scrapers/towels
- * Keep grease out of wash water
- Place food scraps in collection containers



DO NOT'S

- Pour oil and grease down drains
- Wash fryers/griddles, pots/pans and plates with water until oil and grease are removed
- Use hot water to rinse grease off surfaces

Boone / Blowing Rock Waterline interconnect update

The waterline interconnect project is still progressing and is scheduled to be completed in the next 30 days. The pump station and meter vault are in the process of being installed. When the project is complete in addition to an emergency water line, there will be 28 fire hydrants on Highway 321 between Boone and Blowing Rock.
