### 3 Hour Parking

In August, the Town Council approved a change to the Town Code that extends 2-hour parking on Main Street, Sunset Drive and Pine Street to 3-hour parking. The new parking time limits will be enforced from 8:00 AM to 7:00 PM, Monday through Saturday. The Police Department will also be purchasing a hand-held computer device for more advanced parking enforcement. The new parking times will not go into effect until new signs are erected after Labor Dav.

#### **Recycling Regulations**

Effective October 1, 2009, I the State of North Carolina has placed a ban on h plastic bottles, wood pallets, and oil filters. We strongly encourage resi-



dents to recycle these items out of their household garbage, as violations to the municipality could result in civil penalties. Recycling centers at the Davant Field Parking Lot and the Aho Dumpster site are available for plastic. #### **Downtown Streetscape Improvements**

Bids were received on August 3rd for Phase I of the Downtown Streetscape Plan. Phase I includes new curb, gutter, sidewalk, landscaping, and drainage improvements from the Martin House to Rumple Church on the west side of Main Street. At the August 11th meeting, Council awarded the low bid of \$127,626.00 to Wilke Construction of Lenoir. Construction will begin sometime this fall. At the same time, Denver Construction will make similar streetscape improvements at First Citizens Bank to the Maple Street corner as part of the completion of the bank renovations.

#### **Outdoor Dining Service Hours Extended**

In August, the Town Council amended the Noise Ordinance by extending outdoor restaurant service hours from 10:00 PM to 12:00 midnight. This allows customers to be served outdoors beyond 10:00 PM; however, the ordinance for control of excessive noise remains in place and begins at 11:00 PM. Violators of the noise ordinance remain subject to a minimum \$100.00 civil penalty escalating up to \$500.00 for repeat offenders.

#### Water & Wastewater Plant Improvements

Construction is complete on Phase I of Water and Wastewater Plant Improvements. The Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) improvements included a new fine screen, secondary clarifier sludge removal improvements, new return activated sludge pump stations, new aerobic digester, miscellaneous tank improvements, piping, valves, electrical work, and all asso-

ciated appurtenances. The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) modifications consisted of a new submersible pump station including non-clog submersible centrifugal pumps, piping, valves, valve vault, electrical work, work, site drainage, paving, and all associappurtenances. ated
