2009-2010 Budget Approved

The Town of Blowing Rock's FY 2009-2010 Budget has been adopted by Town Council. An abbreviated copy is available to the public on the town website www.townofblowingrock.com. The FY 2009-2010 Budget totals \$6,378,025 for all Town operations, capital improvements, and debt service requirements. This is an increase of only \$1,085 over last adopted budget year's \$6,376,940. In recognition of the difficult and challenging economic conditions present, the Budget contains no increase in taxes, fees or other charges. For more Information, call (828) 295-5200.

Paving Approved for FY '09-'10

The Town Council has awarded street paving bids for Ransom Street (between Sunset Drive and Valley Boulevard), Clawson Drive. South White Pine Street and portions of Green Hill Road. Paving should begin in early to mid-July.

Drought Restrictions Lifted

Based on recent rainfall, a full water reservoir, and with support of the NC Department of Environment Water Supply Division, the Town has lifted voluntary water



restrictions. The Town, due to drought conditions, had been under some form of water restrictions since June 2007.

Though restrictions have been lifted, Citizen's are always urged to use our water supply wisely.

Do's and Do Not's for Disposal of Grease

Do:

- Put oil and grease in collection containers
- Remove oil and grease from kitchen utensils, equipment and food preparation areas with scrapers/towels
- Keep grease out of wash water
- Place food scraps in collection containers

Do Not:

- Pour oil and grease down drains
- Wash fryers/griddles, pots/pans and plates with water until oil and grease are removed
- Use hot water to rinse grease off surfaces

Dogs Now Allowed in Various Blowing Rock Parks

In May, the Town Council approved an ordinance allowing dogs in some Town Parks. Dogs are now allowed in Broyhill Park, Annie Cannon Gardens, the Glen Burney Trail area, and on the path surrounding Davant Field. Dogs will also be allowed on the concrete in the bench area overlooking Main Street in Memorial Park. All dogs in these areas must be on a leash not greater than 6 feet in length. Owners must clean up after their dogs.



No dogs will be permitted on the playing surface of Davant Field, at Robbins Memorial Pool, or in Memorial Park other than the bench area designated overlooking Main Street.

Owners who fail to keep their dog on a leash or fail to clean up after the dog will be subject to civil penalties of \$100.00 for the first offense, \$250.00 for the second, and \$500.00 for the third and following offenses.

Pool Project Update



The Town Council received bids for the Robbins Memorial Pool Complex improvements in May and awarded the contract to low bidder Enterline Russell Builders of Blowing Rock, for \$1,052,337.00. The project is be-

ing funded by grants and donations from the following organizations: NC Park and Recreation Trust Fund - \$500,000, Broyhill Family Foundation - \$100,000, Blowing Rock ABC Board - \$140,000, Watauga County - \$50,000, Blowing Rock Community Foundation - \$30,000, Blowing Rock Rotary Club - \$10,000 and Town Pool Reserve Funds. Additional contributions are welcome.

The project consists of the demolition of the existing pool and associated structures, grading, erosion control, swimming pool construction, asphalt paving, concrete paving, sidewalk construction, bath house construction, year-round public restrooms, water and sewer services, storm drainage, and related appurtenances.

Construction at the pool will begin in mid-August (following the beginning of the 2009-2010 school year. This schedule will leave ample time for construction to be complete by the opening of the 2010 pool season.

American Legion Parking

The parking facility project, off Wallingford Street is now complete. This project is being funded through the TDA's occupancy tax proceeds as well as Parking Fund in-lieu fee payments.



The parking facility provides 69 additional public parking spaces in the American Legion area.
