Recycling Regulations

Just a reminder:

The State of North Carolina placed a ban on plastic bottles, wood pallets, and oil filters from being thrown out with household garbage. We strongly encourage residents to recycle these items as violations to the municipality could result in civil penalties.

Recycling Convenience Centers are located at the Davant Field Parking Lot and the Aho Dumpster site that accept plastic, glass, newspaper, and cardboard. You may call Town Hall to have wood and oil filters picked up at the town's earliest convenience.

Downtown Streetscape

Denver Construction completed the streetscape improvements in front of First Citizens and Follow Your Dream during the first week of October. In the

meantime. Wilkie Construction started their contracted section of Phase 1 in

late September in front of Rumple Church. This section of the project will run along the west side of Main Street from Edgewood Cottage to the Martin House. Drainage structures and new curb and gutter have been installed in front of Edgewood Cottage. AT & T has agreed to install conduit and utility vaults on the east side of the street for future underground phone service. Weather permitting the project

should be completed by the first of the year.

Robbins Pool Update



Significant progress has been made on the Robbins Pool Project in the past couple of months. Paddock Pools finished the pool plumbing and under drainage, and the concrete walls and pool floor have been poured. Storm water drainage, pool house foundation and slab are also complete. Enterline and Russell plans to have the pool house structure under roof before winter sets in.

Winterize Your Home

Preparing your home for winter will help avoid messy spring cleanup due to broken water pipes.

Shut off main water supply at the street or basement. If you have a private water supply, turn off the pump and drain the pressure tank.



If heat will be turned off:

- 1. Shut off gas lines at the entrance to your home if present.
- 2. Open all faucets and leave them open to empty pipes.
- 4. Drain the water heater and leave the valve open.
- Remove all water from toilet tanks and bowls.
- 6. If you choose to remove drain traps, plug line to block sewer gas.
- 7. Unplug the refrigerator, thoroughly clean, and prop open the door.
- 8. Unplug all electrical items, except lights on timers.

If heat will be left on:

- 1. Set thermostat to 50 degrees.
- 2. Keep heat turned on in any areas where there are water or drain pipes. If this is impractical, wrap them with electrical heat tape.

BRAHM & Parking Facility

Work continues on the Blowing Rock Art and History Museum and adjacent Town parking facility. Most of the grading has been completed in anticipation of preparing for footer/foundation installation. Boone Construction is aiming to complete footer and foundation construction prior to winter.
