'08-'09 Budget

The Town of Blowing Rock's FY 2008-2009 Budget has been adopted by Town Council. A copy is available to the public t h e town website www.townofblowingrock.com. The 2008-2009 Adopted Budget included a combined General Fund and Water/Sewer Fund total of \$6,376,940. The budget has a tax rate set at \$0.28 per \$100 valuation, which is the current tax rate. The adopted budget includes a water/sewer rate adjustment of .25 per 1,000 gallons of usage above the minimum 5,000 gallons and a \$5.00 per month charge for all customers to cover the expense related to the plan emergency water interconnection with the Town of Boone and Appalachian State University. Also, due to an increase in commercial landfill tipping fees from \$45 per ton to \$49 per ton by Watauga County, the budget includes an increase in commercial solid waste fees to cover these costs. All other fees and charges will remain unchanged. For more Information call (828) 295-5200.

Planning and Inspections

In May Town Council approved improvements to the Grover C. Robbins Memorial Pool. The plans are to construct a new pool that will have zero entry access, a new pool house and showers, new public restrooms, and a new picnic shelter with playground equipment. The \$1,000,000 project is being funded by grants and donations.

Chetola Mountain Resorts received approval in May to construct two condo buildings with a total of ten 3bedroom units.

A conditional use permit was approved in June to Ransom Street, LLC to construct a two story building on the corner of Ransom Street and Valley Blvd. The proposed 3,656 sq ft building will consist of a restaurant, and retail/office space.

Annexation of the Gideon Ridge area is effective June 30th.

There have been 15 applications for single family homes this year compared to 8 last year at this time.
