Park Picnic Shelter

labor for this project. They will be honored at the Town Council meeting on May 8, 2007. The Town also extends a special thank you to Blowing Rock Winterfest for its donation of \$1,500.00 to assist in the building of the picnic shelter.

Notes From Planning and Inspections

Two ordinances are being considered for adoption at the May 8, 2007 Town Council meeting.

The first is a draft ordinance to make substantial changes to the Trees Preservation and Landscaping sections of the Land Use Code. Some topics of the draft ordinance include:

- Reduction in screening width in Central Business District
- Silviculture (forestry) standards
- Reclassification of protected trees designation of Significant and Historic trees
- Tree retention standards for single-family by protecting trees outside 25' building envelope
- Hazardous tree removal guidelines
- Tree-topping/viewshed standards
- Increased penalties and tree replacement for unauthorized removal of protected trees

The second ordinance for consideration in May is an ordinance to regulate the placement and use of small wind turbines in the R–A (Residential–Agriculture) zoning district. This ordinance establishes guidelines for the erection and use of small wind turbines and towers not exceeding 100 feet in height. Such wind turbines and towers require a conditional use permit.

Monitoring of Downtown Parking

Motorist parking in the downtown area of Blowing Rock are reminded that with the busy summer season approaching officers will begin monitoring downtown traffic and parking more closely. The Town's two hour parking regulation is enforced from 9 a.m.—5 p.m. every day. Other regulations are enforced at all times. Police Officer enforcement will focus on the two hour parking limit, parking in spaces facing the wrong direction, parking in no parking zones, fire lanes, handicap spaces, loading zones, and blocking fire hydrants.

911 House Numbering Campaign

Blowing Rock Fire and Rescue in conjunction with Watauga County is launching a media campaign called "Help Address A Problem." These efforts are in response to reports from EMS agencies that many homes in the high country area are in need of proper premises identification.

The 911 address system is specific about size, contrast, and location of posted house numbers. The numbers should at least 4" high, preferably reflective, and contrasting with their background. Numbers should be posted within 36" of your entrance and visible from the roadway. If your home is more than 100 feet from the road or not visible from the main roadway, the numbers should be posted at the end of your driveway and visible from both directions.
