Attached please find a request from the Hunter's Heroes Memorial Race Committee to hold their 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, & 8<sup>th</sup> annual 5k/10 mile run on Saturday, May 19, 2018, May 18, 2019, & May 16, 2020. The 5k/10 mile run will begin at 8:30 am at the Watauga County Sherriff's Department in Boone. The 5k will end at the Boone Police Department and the 10 mile will end at the Blowing Rock Police Department. There will be water stations at Appalachian State Police Department and several along Highway 321. We propose that the race take place for the following three years; Saturday, May 19, 2018; Saturday, May 18, 2019; Saturday, May 16, 2020. We understand that this year the park is already taken by Art in the Park and we have adjusted our route to end in a different location this year. We want to confirm our dates for the years 2018-2020 with Blowing Rock so we have a set place for the end of our race.
