SUBJECT: Early Voting Site for Watauga County Residents of Blowing Rock

#### **BACKGROUND**:

Early voting in Watauga County begins on October 19 with Election Day occurring on Tuesday, November 7. The early voting concludes on Saturday, November 4 at noon. This is a total of seventeen and one-half voting days. Some interest has been expressed in having an early voting site in Blowing Rock. The process to move this forward is for the Town to request, in writing, to have such a site. This would be considered by the Watauga County Board of Elections, who may or may not allow an alternate site. The number of days can be shorter than the seventeen days. If we could have an early voting site, we would have five people from the County assigned and four of those individuals would earn \$10.50 per hour and one would earn \$12.00 per hour. For an eighthour day, the fee to Blowing Rock would be \$432.00 per day times the number of days, or \$7,560 for the seventeen and one half days. The Town could ask for a shorter period than seventeen days.

Blowing Rock residents who live in Caldwell County would not be able to participate in the early voting in Blowing Rock. They would still have to vote at one of the two early voting sites in Caldwell County, by absentee ballot or wait until Election Day.

In 2015, twenty-nine Blowing Rock citizens voted during the early voting schedule in Boone.

#### **STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:**

Council discuss whether they want early voting or not. If the decision is yes, send a letter to the Watauga County Board of Elections. Sample letter attached.
