SUBJECT: Appalachian Ski Mountain Welcome Center Sign

Amendment to Sign Ordinance

DATE: January 6, 2015

On December 9, 2014, a conditional use permit for construction of a welcome center for Appalachian Ski Mountain on the corner of Hwy 321 and Edmisten Rd was approved by Council. The proposed freestanding sign is currently under staff review and will require some code modification in order to be approved as submitted or with a similar design (plan design and photos attached).

Noting the historical and tourism related significance of Appalachian Ski Mountain and the need to direct traffic, the Applicant is requesting a change to the sign ordinance to allow an increase in overall sign height at the welcome center to 18 feet above grade. The standard ground-mounted freestanding sign is limited to 6 feet above grade. Other tourism attractions in the area have freestanding signs between 18 feet and 28 feet in height. For example:

The Blowing Rock – approximately 18 feet Tweetsie – approximately 23 feet Grandfather Mountain – approximately 28 feet

The sign ordinance currently allows an increase in the overall height of freestanding signs if the ground elevation is below the road elevation of Hwy 321. The maximum sign structure height is limited to 10 feet above the road elevation and not more than 22 feet above the ground elevation. This provision of the ordinance applies to pole-mounted signs only.

In the attached draft ordinance amendment, Appalachian Ski Mountain would be allowed to construct a ground-mounted sign up to 18 feet in height as long as landscaping is maintained at the base of the sign to a minimum height of 3 feet. The App Ski Mtn signature orange color would be allowed on the sign as well.

The sign design indicates a separation of 8 feet between the back of the sign panels to provide an angled view for display. The maximum distance of sign panels in the draft ordinance is 10 feet.

PLANNING BOARD RECOMMENDATION

The Planning Board reviewed the draft ordinance at their regular December 18th meeting and made a recommendation to approve the draft ordinance with some modifications. Those modifications are reflected in the attached draft ordinance.

ORDINANCE NO. 2015-01

AN ORDINANCE TO MODIFY SIGN REGULATIONS SPECIFIC TO THE APPALACHIAN SKI MOUNTAIN WELCOME CENTER

WHEREAS, the Article 17 of the Land Use Ordinance provides sign regulations within the Town of Blowing Rock's planning and zoning jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, Appalachian Ski Mountain has been a unique tourism partner with Town of Blowing Rock and the overall Blowing Rock and High Country community for over 50 years; and

WHEREAS, Appalachian Ski Mountain has displayed a directional billboard across from the Hwy 321/Edmisten Road intersection for over 40 years; and

WHEREAS, with the pending removal of the billboard triggered by bridge construction for an access road, Appalachian Ski Mountain will lose an effective directional sign that cannot be replaced due to a federal law protecting scenic byways (Blue Ridge Parkway); and

WHEREAS, Appalachian Ski Mountain is authorized to construct a welcome center on the corner of Edmisten Road and Hwy 321; and

WHEREAS, Appalachian Ski Mountain draws thousands of visitors to the area and many of those visitors are traveling at night, needing clearly recognizable signs and landmarks; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Blowing Rock Land Use Ordinance limits the overall height of an on-premise ground mounted sign and limits sign face separation; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board and Town Council find there should be exceptions to the sign ordinance limitations based on the historic and unique tourism benefits associated with Appalachian Ski Mountain; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board and Town Council confirm that the regulation of directional signage is consistent with the 2014 Comprehensive Plan Update.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Blowing Rock, North Carolina, that:

Section 1. Section 16-17.12.3 of the Land Use Ordinance is hereby added and will read as follows:

"Section 16-17.12.3 Appalachian Ski Mountain Welcome Center Sign. Due to its unique tourism/directional-related significance based on skier traffic volume and

nightly activities, the Appalachian Ski Mountain Welcome Center shall be allowed to construct a ground-mounted freestanding sign up to 18 feet from the ground. The overall length of the sign shall not exceed 17 feet. The sign face shall be limited to 60 square feet per side based on the posted speed limit exceeding 35 mph, similar to allowances in Section 16-17.12.2.2. The sign faces shall not be separated by more than 10 feet. All sides of the base of the sign shall be landscaped to a height not less than 3 feet above grade.

Unless otherwise specified herein, this sign shall meet the size, style, height, materials, and design criteria in Section 16-17.12 and shall be located outside the NCDOT designated right-of-way. The sign colors are regulated by Conditional Use Permit No. 2014-04, approved on December 9, 2014.

The sign shall meet all requirements of this Article with regard to lighting, maintenance and safety."

Section 2. <u>Severability</u>; <u>Conflict of Laws</u>. If this ordinance or application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the ordinance which can be given separate effect and to that end, the provisions of this ordinance are declared to be severable. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Honorable Mayor and Town Council:

The board of directors of the Blowing Rock Chamber of Commerce is presenting this letter to encourage the Town to continue in the spirit of forward progress by working with Appalachian Ski Mountain to facilitate Appalachian Ski Mountain's proposed Welcome Center to be located on US 321 and Ski Mountain Road.

Since 1963, Appalachian Ski Mountain and the Moretz family have been instrumental in making Blowing Rock a year round tourism destination. By adding winter sports to the list of "attractions" in the summer and fall, the winter economy of Blowing Rock has improved dramatically over the years. For example, in 1963, there were only a couple of restaurants that operated here year round. Today, there are 28 restaurants operating year round within the city limits. In 1963 there were only two or three hotels operating year round while today there are 16 hotels and inns open year round.

In addition to the significant contributions from the introduction of skiing in the High Country, the Town has benefited from the volunteerism of the Moretz family. The Chamber encourages the Council to be solution-oriented as it considers Appalachian Ski Mountain's request(s) to enable it to maintain a signage presence on US 321 after the removal of its almost-historic billboard.






