## Property Check Program

The Blowing Rock Police Department offers a Property Check Program for our citizens. Any resident of Blowing Rock that owns a home or other property that will be vacant during the winter months can request extra patrols by completing a Property Check Information Sheet which can be found at Blowing Rock Town Hall, the Blowing Rock Police Department or on the Town of Blowing Rock website at www.townofblowingrocknc.gov. There is no fee for this service.

# Did you know Blowing Rock has an Electric Car Charging Station?

Did you know Blowing Rock has an Electric Vehicle Charging Station? The unit is capable of charging 2 vehicles at a time and has designated parking in the lower portion of the American Legion Parking deck. The unit is capable of charging any electric vehicle and is only \$5 for a 2 hour session. Blowing Rock is proud to offer this service to a growing number of electric vehicle users.



## Kinder Basketball Registration

Kinder Basketball registration for 3-5 year olds will begin on January 14th for Blowing Rock taxpayers and open registration will begin on January 21st. To receive the taxpayer rate, a copy of your Blowing Rock tax bill (not Watauga/Caldwell County) must be attached. The taxpayer rate is \$30 and the non-taxpayer rate is \$40. Kinder Basketball will meet twice a week for four weeks at the Blowing Rock Elementary School Gym, beginning late February . ## Could a Leaking Toilet Be Running Up Your Water Bill?

One of the most common causes of higher than usual water bills is a leaking toilet. You may believe that if you don't see or hear the water, that it could not possibly be leaking but, as detailed below, there are several things that can contribute to a costly situation with a toilet leak:

<u>Stuck/Open Flapper:</u> chain that connects the flush handle to the flapper can get stuck in the down position causing usage up to 4800 gallons per day or roughly 200 gallons per hour!!!

<u>Worn/Warped Flapper:</u> (silent leak): normal wear and/or mineral buildup on flapper over time caused by accumulated levels of chemicals that purify the water, in-tank cleaners (these will destroy flappers quickly)

Fill Valve's Float: a cracked/misaligned float will take on water and cause the fill valve to run slowly and continuously

Failed Fill Valve: normal wear and mineral deposit buildup prevents the valve's ability to shut off completely

<u>Fractured/Broken Toilet Tank:</u> caused by stress/impact, will cause the fill valve to continuously replenish the tank, leading to total collapse and massive flooding to your property.

Ruptured/Leaking Supply Line: rubber lining or fitting joint can break down

Important Note: Toilet leaks DO NOT qualify for leak adjustments per Town Ordinance Section 14-15.1.

### What Should You Do If You Suspect a Toilet is Leaking?

Add a packet of Kool-Aid or 5-10 drops of food coloring to the tank. If that color shows up in your bowl after a few minutes, you have a leaking toilet and should contact a plumber.
