Bi-Annual Clean-Up



The Town has scheduled the "Fall Bi-Annual Clean-Up" during the week of October 10 - 14. Please do not block any ditches or drains. This pick-up includes white goods, yard debris (leaves, tree branches), mattresses, paint cans, etc. Paint cans need to be opened for paint to solidify or add cat litter to paint to absorb liquid. Residents do not need to call Town Hall to have their names on a list. The Bi-Annual Clean-Up is offered in the fall and spring of each year.

It will be recognized as the Blowing Rock American Legion Building. Post #256 will still have full use of the building and the Town will be responsible for its' maintenance and operation.

Water Leaks



Did you know that water leaks in a single home can account for, on average, enough water to fill a backyard swimming pool, about 10,000 gallons of water?

High water bills are usually caused by leaks in the home. The following tips are ways to help reduce the occurrence of high water bills:

Check all faucets for drips

A leaky faucet that drips at the rate of one drip per second can waste more than 3,000 gallons per year of water. Leaky faucets can be easily fixed by replacing washers and gaskets or by replacing the whole faucet.

Check toilets for constantly running water

A toilet that is leaking can waste 200 gallons or more of water per day. To check for a leaky toilet put a small amount of food coloring or Kool-aid in the toilet tank, do not flush the toilet for at least 15 minutes. If the food coloring shows up in the bowl without flushing, you probably have a leaking flapper or plunger ball valve. Be sure to flush the toilet after testing to avoid staining the toilet tank. If you find a leak, replace the entire rubber flapper.

Check outside faucets and irrigation systems

Every spring irrigation systems should be checked before use. During the winter months frost and freezing could cause damage to the system. An irrigation system with pressure set at 60 pounds per square inch that has a leak about the thickness of a dime can waste around 6,300 gallons of water per month.



Sewer Extension Project

M&M construction continues work on the Sewer Extension project which will provide sewer service to approximately 11 homes. As part of the project, the water line along Wallingford is being upgraded and an additional fire hydrant is being installed. While the Wallingford portion of the project is complete, the Main Street portion is expected to be completed in the next week.

Town Recognized for Green Initiative



The Town received a Level Two Intermediate Green Challenge recognition award from the NC League of Municipalities for its efforts in becoming more environmentally friendly. The Green Challenge program was developed as a way to recognize municipal activities and accomplishments in saving energy, natural resources and money. Some of the items that contributed to the Town's upgrade in status were: Residential Curbside Recycling, Internal Office Recycling, LED Christmas Light Replacement Program and Tree Preservation/Replacement Program. During the last 12 months GDS, Inc. has collected 136.83 tons of recyclables, such as glass, plastic, aluminum,

and other such items. In addition Public Works has collected 67.58 tons of cardboard from Commercial businesses.

Planning and Zoning Updates

Six Pence Pub

 CUP No. 2011-01 for Six Pence Pub to construct a patio for 32 outdoor dinning seats is underway. This week, final steel should be delivered and soon after concrete decking should be poured. The patio is tentatively scheduled to open in October.



Blowing Rock Hospital

Watauga Medical Center, Inc. recently purchased 43 acres just beyond the Blue Ridge Parkway, to construct a post-acute medical campus. As part of the initial process to request future water and sewer service, Town Council approved an annexation request effective June 30, 2011 for this land. The Hospital is currently seeking a Certificate of Need (CON) from the state prior to proceeding with plans and permitting applications.
